

In a couple of weeks, some members of the church will gather at Tower Hill, Michigan for a 24-hour retreat, we are calling "24 Hours in the Wilderness," as we continue the process of discerning how we can carry out the mission Jesus charged us with, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing in the name of the Father, Son, and of the Holy Spirit..." in Matthew 28:19. As we go, we earnestly solicit your prayers. Let us join together to seek God's will for our ministry.

As we face the uncertainty of our future, as well as that of the church, we can be certain of the promise of Matthew 28: 20, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." #### **Support Needed for Costa Rica Mission Trip**

In July, Dan and I and Pastor David and his wife Christi will be going on a mission trip to Costa Rica. We will be joining a mission team from the First Church of Lombard. The team will be building two homes in one week for two families in dire need of a safe, dry and secure home. The host is Costa Rica Mercy Homes Ministries which has built over 220 homes in Costa Rica in the past 15 years. Dan has been on 3 previous mission trips and Doris has been on 2 previous mission trips in Costa Rica with Mercy Homes Ministries. They have seen the great need for housing there.



While the mission team members each pay for all of their travel and living expenses, money needs to be raised for the materials and some local skilled labor for the two houses that we will be building. The cost for each home is \$8,000. The homes are very simple and small (about 400 square feet), but they provide a concrete floor, a roof that keeps rain out, windows and doors that close and can be locked, and a very modest indoor toilet and shower. The families who get these homes are living in shacks, with dirt floors, leaky roofs, no windows or doors and no indoor plumbing.



In addition to your prayer support, we hope that members of our congregation will be willing to provide financial support for the building of the two homes. Any contributions can be made to our church and designated for Costa Rica mission trip. CCVP will then write a check for the total contributions to the First Church of Lombard who will send it to Mercy Homes. To know in advance that we will have the monies to build two homes, we hope that donations can be made by June 1.


